Water-Free Urinals in Public Places

Yucca Valley – Water-free urinals are the latest trend in water conservation and a recent addition to some public facilities in Yucca Valley. In a recent partnership with the Town of Yucca Valley and the Hi-Desert Water District, there are water-free urinals now at the California Welcome Center, the Community Center, the Town of Yucca Valley Public Works Department facilities and at the Hi-Desert Water District facilities. Each urinal is estimated to save 1-3 gallons per flush adding up to thousands of gallons a month.

Jim Schooler, Director of Community Services with Town of Yucca Valley says, “We try very hard to be responsible in our use of water. Every step we can take to economize will benefit our community in the long run. We are pleased to partner with the Hi-Desert Water District on this project.”

Water-free urinals are showing up in sport stadiums, universities and commercial properties. As water becomes more scarce and expensive, conservation is even more important. “Everything we can do to reduce water in our daily lives assures that we are making the most of the precious water that we often take for granted. It is our goal to encourage the retrofit of all urinals with water-free models that will put less demand on our water resources,” says Jennifer Cusack, Public Information Officer at the Hi-Desert Water District. “The less water that goes down the drain is not only good conservation practice, it is better on the environment and on the pocket book.”
